**Purpose and objective of PACT meetings**

The objective of this meeting is to provide an opportunity for members of the local community to raise their community priorities or concerns, receive crime prevention advice, and be updated as to what the police and partners have been doing to address the priorities and concerns raised at the previous meeting.

**Previous Meeting Overview - You Said:**

What communities raised at the last meeting –

During the PACT meeting, several public concerns and issues were raised by residents. These included an increase in residential burglaries, reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) in the Dewsbury South ward area, and instances of dangerous driving posing risks to both pedestrians and other road users. Additionally, concerns were expressed regarding drug-related activity, which is impacting community safety and wellbeing. Residents also highlighted unease about door-to-door charity collections, with questions around legitimacy and potential links to fraudulent activity.

**Actions Set at the last meeting:**

Following the concerns raised at the PACT meeting, the Neighbourhood Policing Team will implement a series of targeted actions. These include:

- Increased, focused burglary patrols in the Dewsbury South area to deter and detect offenders.
- Dedicated traffic enforcement days of action will be scheduled, supported by the deployment of Operation Trimborg, which is funded by ward councillors and guided by intelligence-led policing.
- Officers will conduct warrants and stop searches where appropriate, to tackle drug-related activity and associated criminal behaviour.

These measures aim to address community priorities and enhance public safety.

**Actions Taken – We Did**

Since the last meeting we have:

Add in most recent local priority updates, plus any additional work conducted across the ward to address the actions set. Include link to any local NPT news releases from the external website and any force news/public releases that may be of benefit to the communities and/or falls in line with the priorities for the ward.

- Increased presence on roads and green areas.
- Increased section 23 warrants

- Increased vehicle document stops

**New Public Concerns and Issues:**

- Noisy cars on the road
- Mud on the road from lorry's transporting hardcore to the railway works

**Actions Set:**

Officer attending to bullet point actions set.

- Continue with police presence – especially now nights are lighter which encourages ASB from teenagers.
- Continue with section 23 warrants where intelligence allows.
- Continue with vehicle stop document checks.
